Dear Referee 4,

I would just like to discuss, for a moment, about the accuracy of replicating the figures.

As you pointed out, its more difficult to come up with an objective metric for the successful replication of figures as opposed to the successful replication of tables, as figures themselves are less precise than tables. The (subjective) definition of “success” that I’ve used in the past, when applied to replicating figures, is whether the text that accompanies the figure in the original paper could also be applied, loosely speaking, to the replicated version of the figure. If the accompanying text still applies to the replicated figure, then the replication was successful.
